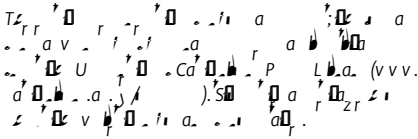


General Policies



Animal Ethics

The University acknowledges its obligation under the Animal Welfare Act, 1999 and recognizes the humane consideration requirements for the care and use of animals in teaching and research must be a standard that are a least a high as those provided by the Act.

The University aims:

- (a) to promote an activity which encourage the careful and consideration of animals which have no greater restriction on their production than would be accepted as reasonable and tolerable by community standard; and
- (b) to ensure that teaching and research involving the use of animals is not hindered by inefficient technique or careless practice.

Application for review and approval must be made to the Animal Ethics Committee using the appropriate form.

Camp, Drug and Alcohol Policy

Human Ethics

The University of Canberra aims to promote excellence and ethical research. The Human Ethics Committee ensures that researchers who work in the human participant will conduct their work with appropriate regard for ethical principle and cultural values, and in accordance with the Treaty of Waitangi. The principle and values include justice, fairness, confidentiality and respect.

All research involving human participants should be conducted in accordance with the ethical norms and be subject to ethical appraisal and approval of both human and end.

Application for review and approval must be made to the Human Ethics Committee using the appropriate form.
